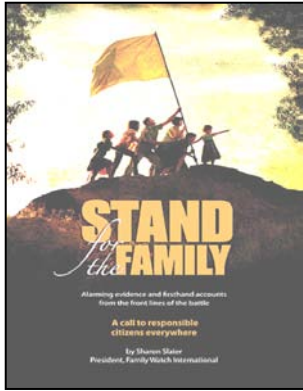

Prominent feminist Charlotte Bunch, a spokesman for the campaign to establish a new UN super office on women’s issues, wrote a revealing paper back in the 1970s. Had the UN delegates seen this paper before they passed a General Assembly resolution to establish the office, it might have given them pause. It is almost certain that the women who campaigned for the creation of the office will be nominated by their colleagues to run the office and that should concern us all.

Consider the following excerpts from Charlotte Bunch’s paper:

“The development of Lesbian-feminist politics as the basis for the liberation of women is our top priority.”

“Lesbians must become feminists and fight against woman oppression, just as feminists must become Lesbians if they hope to end male supremacy.”

“The only way oppressed people end their oppression is by seizing power.”

“As long as straight women see Lesbianism as a bedroom issue, they hold back the development of politics and strategies which would put an end to male supremacy.”

“Being a Lesbian means ending your identification with, allegiance to, dependence on, and support of heterosexuality.”

“Lesbianism is the key to liberation.”²⁰³

The author was promoting sex between women as a way to rebel against men and destroy “male supremacy” in our society. In the view of many feminists, marriage and the family are patriarchal institutions that exist to oppress women.

Unfortunately, lesbians are not the only anti-family activists who have infiltrated the UN and negatively influenced its policies.
